A FLAKY CROSSWORD

The snowflake-shaped grid below consists of six smaller snowflake-shaped segments. Each segment's numbered center will be surrounded by six 7-letter words, each word entered in the direction indicated by the arrows. Clues for these words are grouped by the segment's number. However, within each segment, you must determine which answer goes along which side. The clues in each group have been ordered alphabetically by answer.

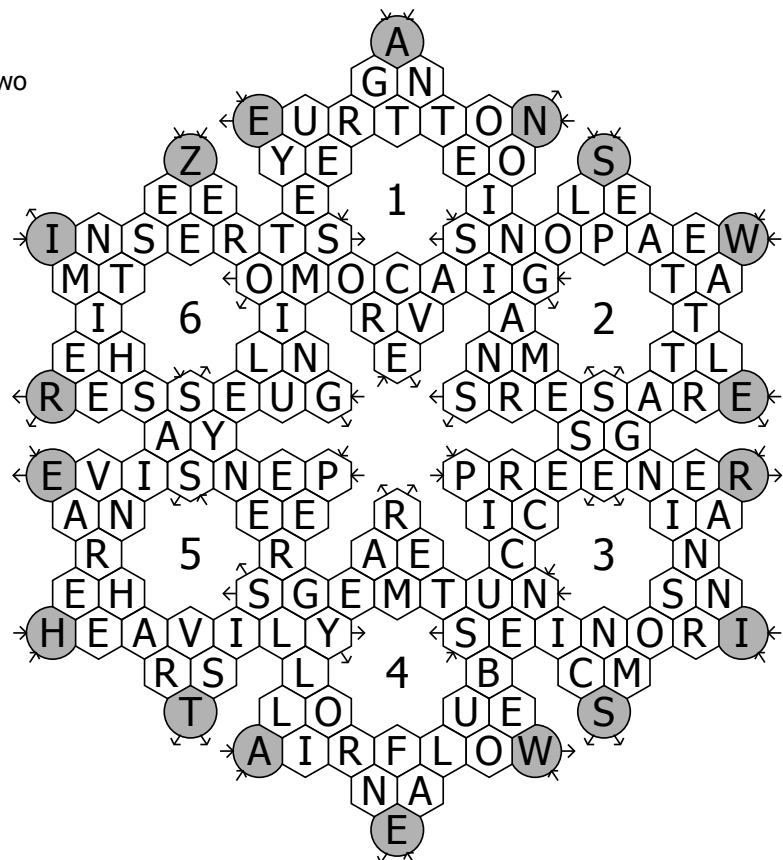

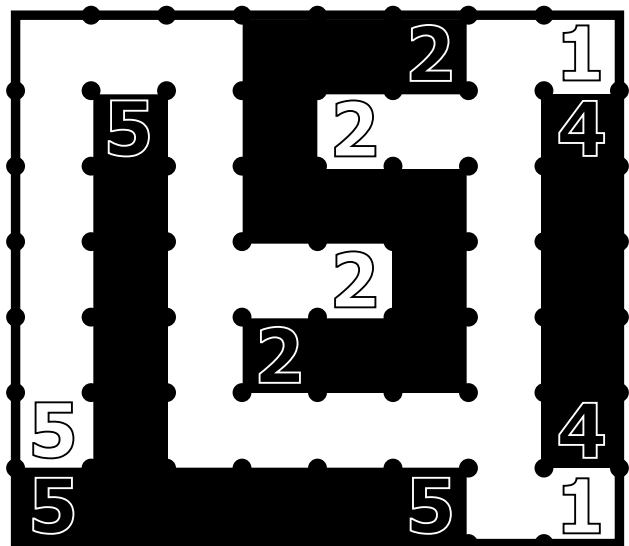

FLAKY LOGIC

Cold weather has partially iced over these four areas of land, and you're in charge of plotting out which squares are ice and which are dirt. A square contains a number **if and only if** it is a "dead end" - that is, it does not have two or more adjacent squares of the same surface type.

The number indicates the distance you can travel in a straight line from that dead end, before hitting an edge or a different surface type. All ice in an area will form a single, connected region. There are no 2x2 regions that consist of a single surface type. An example area and its solution are at the right.

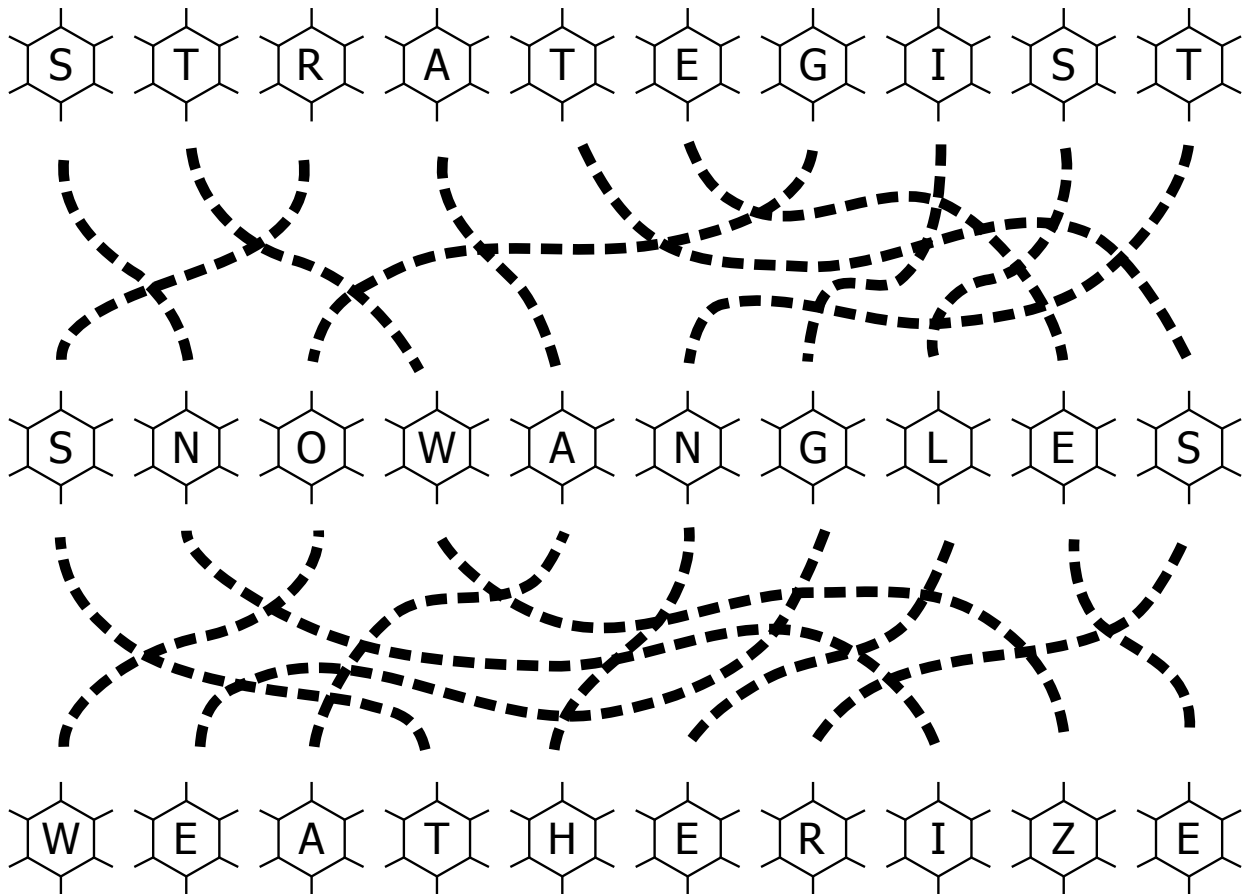


Turned upside-down, the grids spell out STRATEGIST

A FLAKY RIDDLE

The flurry below uses the answers from the previous three puzzles. Two of those answers are the same length; take the noun and place it in the top row, and take the verb and place it in the bottom row. Finally, take the remaining answer in the middle row. You'll then reveal the answer to the following riddle:

What do mathematicians make in the winter?



Taking the MEAN (average) of each pair of letters in the alphabet reveals the answer, SNOW ANGLES.
